International Travel

My research at MSUB has taken me to Brazil, Kenya, Peru, Poland, the Netherlands, Cambodia, India, and across the United States several times over. I earned my doctorate in Scotland, during which time explored history and art in France, Italy, and Spain, and toured Austria, Germany, and France with a classical choir. More recently (2016), speaking tours have carried me through the UK, Spain, Luxembourg, and Italy, where I spent ten days on a publisher’s tour to introduce *Eating Earth*, translated into Italian. A month later I traveled to Estonia, Finland, Latvia and the Netherlands to offer presentations.

After college, a Watson Fellowship took me overseas to explore the place of women and nonhuman animals in various religious traditions. I visited remote monasteries in Northern China (including Tibetan regions), and studied for one month in H.H. Dalai Lama’s school in

Dharamsala, India. I traveled alone through poverty-ridden Bangladesh, visited the West Bank, stayed in the homes of Palestinians, witnessed ancient history in Egypt and Turkey, and explored holy sites in Israel.

Before college, with my sister I scrambled over an 18,000 foot pass in Nepal with only a sweater and tennis shoes... and no maps. My understanding of time was changed by the quiet villages in Burma, India, and China. My idea of “necessities” was rearranged when all of my sister’s things were stolen. (Who would be foolish enough to sleep under the stars on a beach in India?) Reconnecting with Western civilization in Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Japan only caused me to long for the terraced ridges of Nepal and weeks of hiking in the Himalayas. I would not be who I am if not for early travels; it was on these trips that I began to seriously explore religions and different philosophies of life.

While still a teenager I hitchhiked in foreign lands, staying as a guest in the homes of strangers. I was exposed to many different points of view and I learned that people are generally kind and helpful. I also learned how beautiful this world is, and that any given way of living is but one among many.

I recently traveled to Peru, Kenya, Cambodia, and various nations across Europe and North America to examine the intersection between preserving wildlife and preserving cultures in the hill country of Kenya, help protect yellow-tailed woolley monkey in Peru, visit a bear and an elephant sanctuary in Cambodia, and engage in a comparative analysis of the effectiveness of various animal rescue efforts in the U.S. In recent years I have offered talks and collaborated with others as far afield as India, Brazil, Luxembourg, Spain, and England.
